

This is the time of year we are out in our gardens. Here are some health tips for gardening!

Gardening can be a great way to enjoy the outdoors, get physical activity, beautify the community, and grow nutritious fruits and vegetables. If you are a beginner or expert gardener, health and safety should always be a priority. Below are some tips to help keep you safe and healthy so that you can enjoy the beauty and fun that gardening can bring.

Dress to protect.

Gear up to protect yourself from lawn and garden pests, harmful chemicals, sharp or motorized equipment, insects, and harmful rays of too much sun. Wear safety goggles, sturdy shoes, and long pants to prevent injury when using power tools and equipment.

- Protect your hearing when using machinery. If you have to raise your voice to talk to someone who is an arm's length away, the noise can be potentially harmful to your hearing.
- Wear gloves to lower the risk for skin irritations, cuts, and certain contaminants.
- Use insect repellent containing DEET. Protect yourself from diseases caused by mosquitoes and ticks. Wear long-sleeved shirts, and pants tucked in your socks. You may also want to wear high rubber boots since ticks are usually located close to the ground.
- Lower your risk for sunburn and skin cancer. Wear long sleeves, wide-brimmed hats, sun shades, and sunscreen with sun protective factor (SPF) 15 or higher.

Prevent injury.

Powered and unpowered tools and equipment can cause serious injury. Limit distractions, use chemicals and equipment properly, and be aware of hazards to lower your risk for injury.

Make sure equipment is working properly.

Sharpen tools carefully.

Keep harmful chemicals, tools, and equipment out of children's reach.

Know your limits in the heat.

- Even being out for short periods of time in high temperatures can cause serious health problems. Monitor your activities and time in the sun to lower your risk for heat-related illness.
- If you're outside in hot weather for most of the day you'll need to make an effort to drink more fluids.
- Avoid drinking liquids that contain alcohol or large amounts of sugar, especially in the heat.
- Take breaks often. Try to rest in shaded areas so that your

- body's thermostat will have a chance to recover. Stop working if you experience breathlessness or muscle soreness.
- Pay attention to signs of heat-related illness, including extremely high body temperature, headache, rapid pulse, dizziness, nausea, confusion, or unconsciousness.
- Watch people who are at higher risk for heat-related illness, including infants and children up to four years of age; people 65 years of age or older; people who are overweight; people who push themselves too hard during work or exercise; and people who are physically ill or who take certain medications (i.e. for depression, insomnia, or poor circulation).

Tips for persons with disabilities and physical activity.

- Talk to your health care provider if you have physical, mental, or environmental concerns that may impair your ability to work in the garden safely.
- If you have arthritis, use tools that are easy to grasp and that fit your ability. Research shows that 2½ hours per week of moderate physical activity can give you more energy and can help relieve arthritis pain and stiffness.
- If you are taking medications that may make you drowsy or impair your judgment or reaction time, don't operate machinery, climb ladders, or do activities that may increase your risk for injury.
- Listen to your body. Monitor your heart rate, level of fatigue, and physical discomfort.
- Call 911 if you get injured, experience chest and arm pain, dizziness, lightheadedness, or heat-related illness.
- Be active for at least 2½ hours a week. Include activities that raise your breathing and heart rates and that strengthen your muscles. Help kids and teens be active for at least 1 hour a day.
- If you have been inactive, start out with just a few minutes of physical activity each day. Gradually build up time and intensity.

Get vaccinated.

Vaccinations can prevent many diseases and save lives. All adults should get a tetanus vaccination every 10 years. Tetanus lives in the soil and enters the body through breaks in the skin. Because gardeners use sharp tools, dig in the dirt, and handle plants with sharp points, they are particularly prone to tetanus infections. Before you start gardening this season, make sure your tetanus/diphtheria (Td) vaccination is up to date.

Ask your health care provider if you need any other vaccinations.

Have a fun, safe and productive garden this year!

Welcome and Call to Order

The Secretary's Report from December was approved.

The Treasurer's Report from December was approved.

Pastor's Updates

Pastor will not be here this next Sunday. Betsie Graham will be leading service.

Pastor will be on sabbatical from June 1 through August 31. We reviewed an update on pulpit supply and who will be working with us during Pastor's sabbatical. Pastor will likely be traveling to New York as part of his sabbatical research in July.

Next year: There could be a change to Holy Week service times, since 7:30 evening services get too late! We discussed changing these times to coincide with our 4:30 and 6:30 p.m. mid-week times so they're a little earlier.

Our handling of the snow day in April and making the decision to call church off early went well. General process: Pastor connects with council presidents early in the morning to determine whether church should be cancelled. In this case, it was pretty obvious that it was safer to make sure everyone stayed home!

Pastor's been scheduling visits, but the number of people he visits is really low. He's now visiting most individuals quarterly.

North New Hope members are enjoying a First Communion celebration on May 6.

Synod Assembly meeting is coming up on May 18: Mark and Tammy from New Hope and Chelsea from Faith are attending.

Drive Your Tractor to Church Update

We compared two options for button designs and agreed that we all like the gold color in honor of the events "golden anniversary."

300 buttons were ordered last year. We agreed that decreasing this count to 250 would be sufficient.

Niemuth's is scheduled for the pig roast again. We planned for 325 last year and there was no food left! We agreed it would be good to plan for 350 this year.

Historically, we donate to local groups and ask them to all participate. We agreed that we'll collect the funds, make sure costs are covered and then divide remaining donations amongst local groups.

Scheduling kitchen help has been a challenge. We recommended signup sheets for scheduling specific groups of people and making sure all times are covered could be helpful.

Musicians have been confirmed.

We discussed possibilities for selling t-shirts as an additional fundraiser.

Rejuvenating our Communities

Pastor invited us to contemplate what it means to prune back the vine and allow fruit to grow, and how this could be applied to our church. We discussed ways to reinvigorate our communities, including the possible participation in a Reimagining Church program.

Council members shared stories and possibilities from other congregations and events about ways we could grow our community and focus our efforts on what really works for where we are now.

Our next Joint Council Meeting will be on Monday, July 16 at 6:00 p.m. at New Hope.










Faith & New Hope Newsletter
