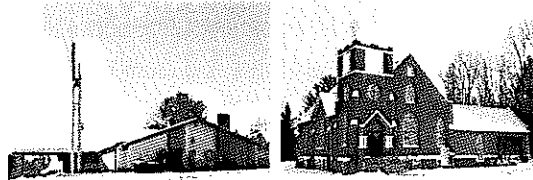
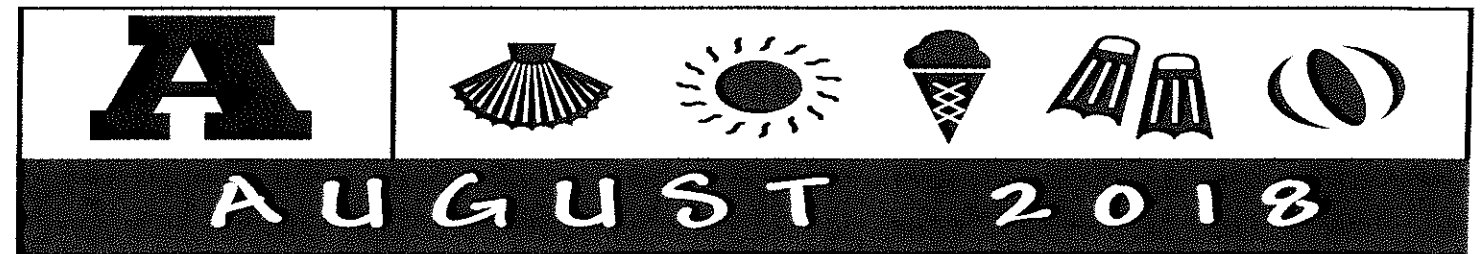

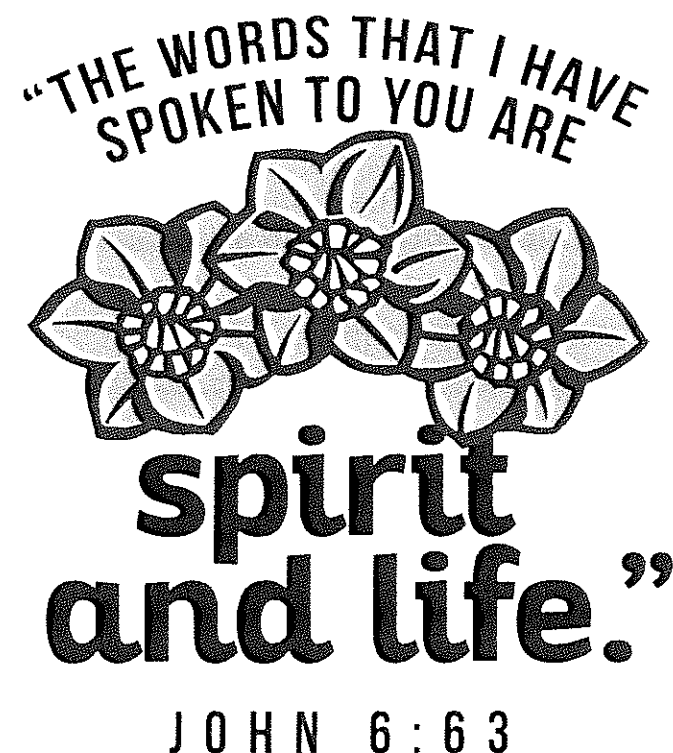

New Hope WELCA

Ladies Aide to WELCA

Years ago the traditional name for the ladies of a congregation was called 'Ladies Aide'. This served well when most families centered their lives over their homes and church. Much has changed with huge strides in travel, communication, education, and life styles. These changes meant more and more women sought employment and expanded their abilities to a fuller extent. Women reached out to other congregations and formed a national group, WELCA, Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America. This meant reaching out in the world with things like Lutheran World Relief, medical and teaching missionaries, disaster aide, etc.

Areas of each state were divided into synods and conferences, so groups could meet for inspiration and enlightenment for half day meetings (spring and fall). Our church is in the Tomorrow River Conference. Time has changed since these groups were first formed. Now we find an aging population that is living longer, but also having health issues that limit their activities. Younger women are usually working, and often doing double-duty with raising a family. Those in the middle are often settled in jobs or careers which are needed in this economy. Thus less time is available for the usual afternoon Bible Study and sharing done in the past. Most churches try to adapt to the needs of all ages, but finding a good fit for all is tricky.

At a recent meeting (before church service), the ladies of North New Hope looked at what we can do to serve our congregation, families, and world. Do we want to change our focus to just our local church? Or are you interested in all of the possible WELCA programs? Shall we continue with LWR projects and senior quilts? We do not want to shut down, but need all of you to have your thoughts shared. This means every female in our church from HS grad to seniors. You may not be interested in this aspect of our congregation, but your input is also very important to us.

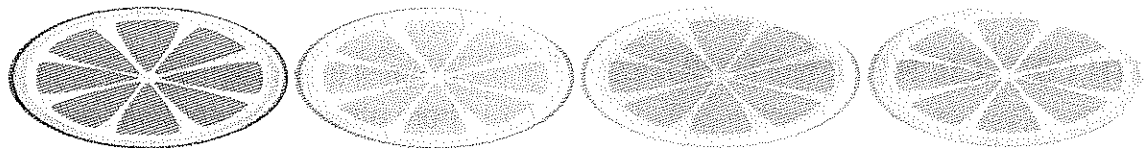

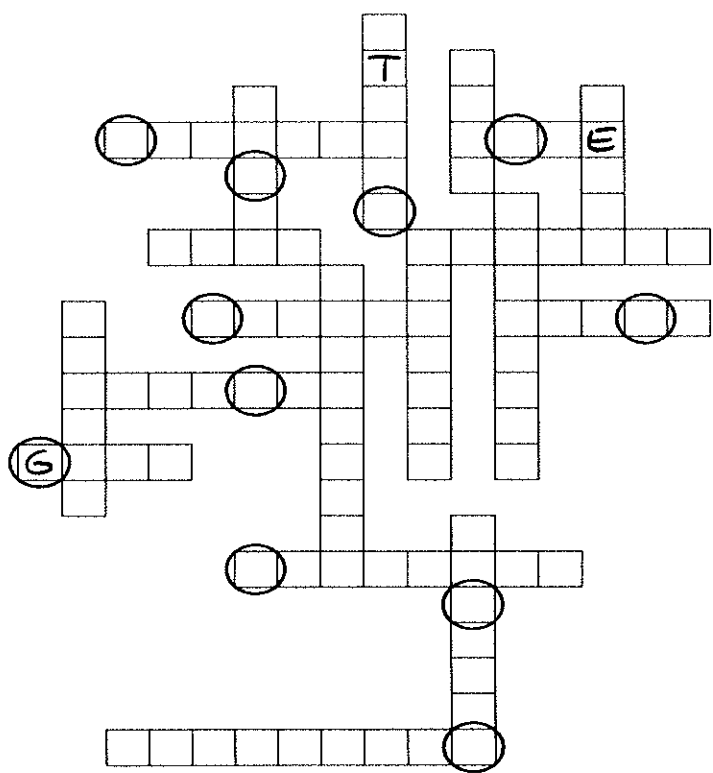

BUMBLE BEE BALLS

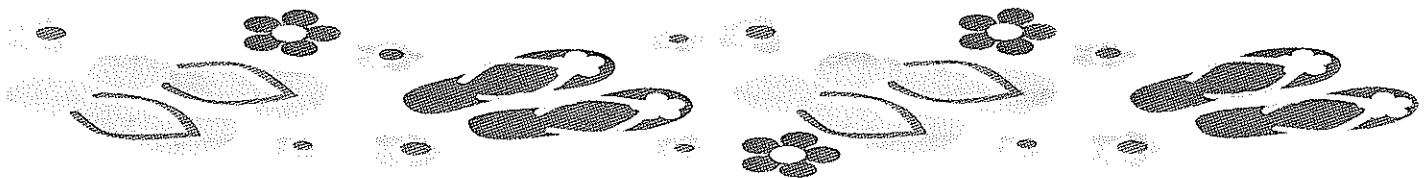
Make these yummy treats as a summer snack.

What you need:

- 1 cup peanut butter
- 1½ oz. instant oats
- ¼ cup honey
- ½ cup instant milk powder
- ½ cup dark chocolate chips
- 40 mini chocolate chips
- 20 slivered almonds
- 40 sliced almonds
- Adult help

What you do:

1. In a bowl, mix peanut butter, oats, honey and instant milk powder into dough. If too dry, add more peanut butter or honey.
2. Roll dough into 20 long balls. Place them on a cookie sheet and refrigerate.
3. Melt the dark chocolate chips and place them in a zippered baggie. Cut a tiny bit off one corner.
4. Remove dough from refrigerator. Squeeze thin lines of chocolate as stripes onto the bee bodies.
5. Use two mini chocolate chips for eyes, a slivered almond for a stinger and two sliced almonds as wings. Enjoy!



FOOD SAFETY

Every year, an estimated 1 in 6 Americans (or 48 million people) get sick, 128,000 are hospitalized, and 3,000 die of foodborne diseases. However, certain groups of people are more likely to get a foodborne illness (also called food poisoning) or get seriously ill. People more likely to get a foodborne illness are: Children younger than 5 years of age and adults aged 65 and older. Others are those with weakened immune systems from medical conditions or their treatment, such as cancer, HIV/AIDS, or diabetes and pregnant women.

Why are some people at higher risk?

Some groups of people are more likely to get food poisoning because their body's ability to fight germs and sickness is not as effective as other people's for a variety of reasons.

Young children have immune systems that are still developing, so their body's ability to fight germs and sickness isn't as strong. Food poisoning can be particularly dangerous for them because illness can lead to diarrhea and dehydration. Children younger than 5 are three times more likely to be hospitalized if they get a Salmonella infection. And kidney failure strikes 1 out of 7 children under age 5 who are diagnosed with E. coli infection.

Older adults have a higher risk because as people age, their immune systems and organs don't recognize and get rid of harmful germs as well as they once did. Nearly half of people aged 65 and older who have a lab-confirmed foodborne illness from Salmonella, Campylobacter, Listeria or E. coli are hospitalized.

People with weakened immune systems can't fight germs and sickness as effectively. People on dialysis are 50 times more likely to get a Listeria infection.

Pregnant women are more likely than other people to get sick from certain germs. For example, pregnant women are 10 times more likely to get a Listeria infection.

How can I prevent food poisoning?

If you or someone you take care of is in one of these high-risk groups, learn which foods to avoid and what steps you can take to prevent food poisoning.

People who are more likely to get food poisoning should not eat the following: undercooked or raw animal products (such as meat, poultry, eggs, or seafood); raw or lightly cooked sprouts; unpasteurized (raw) milk and juices; soft cheese (such as queso fresco), unless it is labeled as made with pasteurized milk;

What are symptoms of food poisoning?

Food poisoning may cause symptoms like diarrhea, vomiting, upset stomach, or nausea. See your doctor if you have:

High fever (over 101.5°F)

Blood in stools

Frequent vomiting that prevents you from keeping liquid down

Diarrhea that lasts more than three days

Signs of dehydration, including decrease in urination, dry mouth and throat, and feeling dizzy when standing up.

Food Safety Tips

Following four simple steps at home — Clean, Separate, Cook, and Chill — can help protect you and your loved ones from food poisoning. **CLEAN:** Wash your hands and surfaces often. Germs that cause food poisoning can survive in many places and spread around your kitchen.

Wash hands for 20 seconds with soap and water before, during, and after preparing food and before eating. Wash your utensils, cutting boards, and countertops with hot, soapy water. Rinse fresh fruits and vegetables under running water.

SEPARATE: Don't cross-contaminate. Raw meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs can spread germs to ready-to-eat foods—unless you keep them separate. Use separate cutting boards and plates for raw meat, poultry, and seafood.

When grocery shopping, keep raw meat, poultry, seafood, and their juices away from other foods. Keep raw meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs separate from all other foods in the fridge.

COOK: To the right temperature. Food is safely cooked when the internal temperature gets high enough to kill germs that can make you sick. The only way to tell if food is safely cooked is to use a food thermometer. You can't tell if food is safely cooked by checking its color and texture.

CHILL: Refrigerate promptly. Keep your refrigerator below 40°F and know when to throw food out. Refrigerate perishable food within 2 hours. (If outdoor temperature is above 90°F, refrigerate within 1 hour.) Thaw frozen food safely in the refrigerator, in cold water, or in the microwave. Never thaw foods on the counter, because bacteria multiply quickly in the parts of the food that reach room temperature.

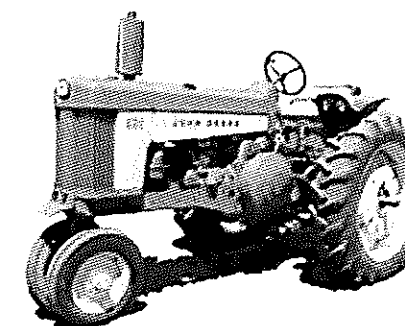

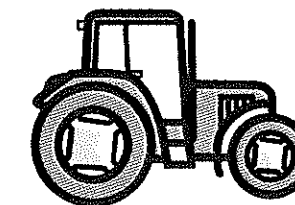
LWR SCHOOL KITS
