On the Sundays we don't celebrate Holy Communion, we use a liturgy called Service of the Word. The liturgy begins pointing us to the other sacrament we less often embrace - Baptism. We don't have many parents lining up to bring their children for baptism these days, so we haven't often heard the promises of Baptism. With that in mind, we will explore the promises of Baptism during Lent. They are...

PARISH NURSE ARTICLE February 2024

As we think about starting the year off with a healthy lifestyle, one change could be quitting smoking. Here is some information from the CDC website that could help:

Quitting smoking is one of the most important actions you can take to improve your health. This is true regardless of your age or how long you have been smoking. It's never too late to quit smoking. Over time, people who quit smoking see many benefits to their health. It reduces your risk of heart disease, cancer, lung disease, and other smoking-related illnesses. After you smoke your last cigarette, your body begins a series of positive changes that continue for years.

- Minutes after you quit, your heart rate drops.
- After 1 to 12 months, coughing and shortness of breath decrease.
- After 1 to 2 years, your risk of heart attack drops sharply.
- After 5 to 10 years, the added risk of mouth,
 throat, and voice box cancers drops by half.

After 10 to 15 years, the added risk of lung cancer drops by half.

There are many resources to help you on your quit journey:

Proven treatments like counseling and quit smoking medicines can help you quit and

stay quit. Using counseling and medication together can give you the best chance of success.

"Quitlines" provide free coaching—over the phone—to help you quit smoking. When you call 1-800-QUIT-NOW (tele:1-800-784-8669) you can speak confidentially with a highly trained quit coach. Quitlines are available throughout the United States, and coaching help is available in several languages. Some Quitlines offer text messaging support.

The National Texting Portal connects you (adults 18 years of age and older in the United States) with mobile text message-based support to help you quit smoking.

The "quitSTART App" is a free smartphone app that helps you quit smoking with tailored tips, inspiration, and challenges.

By making a quit plan and using these resources, 2024 can be the year you quit for good. Use the new year to welcome the possibilities of a smokefree life today!



88.5FM The Family Radio Network's Help for the Homeless Hygiene Drive to collect hygiene and cleaning supplies for local crisis agencies.

Last spring, 927 area businesses, churches and schools hosted collection boxes and encouraged their staff, clients, members, and students to donate hygiene and cleaning supplies for their local shelters and crisis programs through The Family Radio Network's 31st annual Help for the Homeless Hygiene Drive. Their donations totaled \$665,000 worth of supplies for 101 local crisis programs in 19 communities. The community "gets" this! Most of us can afford to buy an extra bottle of shampoo or package of

to buy an extra bottle of snampoo or package of toilet tissue. Donations remain in the community where they are collected.

In the Stevens Point area, we'll be collecting for Evergreen Community Initiatives

Donations of hygiene and cleaning supplies make it possible for our local crisis agencies to concentrate their limited financial resources on providing qualified staff, safe housing, nutritious food, education, and counseling to those they serve. Hygiene and cleaning supplies can be expensive and are not covered by Wisconsin FoodShare (food stamps / SNAP). This donation helps BOTH the crisis programs and those they serve.

Purchase new, unused hygiene and cleaning supplies and drop them off at the donation box in Narthex

Most urgent needs include:

- Soaps: laundry, dish, soft, shower gel, 2-in-1 shampoo
- Trash bags (shelters especially need these for bedrooms)
- Diapers (sizes 3-6 and Pull-Ups)
- Deodorant (unscented)
- Wet wipes
- Toilet paper
- Paper towels
- Disposable razors
 Tampons and maxi pads
