Jim Gaffigan has a comedy routine about the fall season that I find entertaining. I'm

among those he pokes fun at when I stand in awe of the foliage and its changing colors. He points out, ironically and comedically, that the beauty of the fall happens because the leaves are perishing. "Why are these people staring and smiling at us? We're dying! We need chlorophyll!"

While we enjoy the fall foliage and its deathly beauty, it is nature's prelude & parable of the promise of Resurrection. At the end of October on the 26th, our catechism students will be moving from one season of faith to another as they move through the **Rite of the Affirmation** of Baptism, confirming for themselves Christ's promises of Baptism. Flu (Influenza)

October is a great time to get your annual flu vaccination; here is some information about the flu from the CDC website:

Symptoms

I Flu can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can • lead to death. Flu symptoms usually come on suddenly. People who have flu often feel some or all of these signs and symptoms:

Fever (or feeling feverish/chills), cough, sore throat, *runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches chronic medical conditions I fatigue (tiredness), some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults.

Flu complications

Most people who get flu will recover in a few days to less than two weeks, but some people will develop complications (such as pneumonia) as a result of flu, some of which can be life-threatening and result in death. Sinus and ear infections are examples of moderate complications from flu, while pneumonia is a serious flu complication that can result from either flu virus infection alone or from co-infection of flu virus and bacteria. Flu also can make chronic medical problems worse. For example, people with asthma may experience asthma attacks while they have flu, and people with chronic heart disease may experience Have a healthy fall, a worsening of this condition triggered by flu. Anyone can get sick with flu, even healthy people, and serious problems related to flu can happen to anyone at any age, but some people are at higher risk of developing serious flu-related complications if they get sick. This includes people 65 years and older, people of any age with certain chronic medical conditions (such as asthma, diabetes, or heart disease), pregnant women and children younger than 5 years, but especially those younger than 2 years old.

Emergency Warning Signs of Flu Complications

(People experiencing these warning signs should obtain medical care right away.)

Children

Fast breathing or trouble breathing, Bluish lips or face Ribs pulling in with each breath, Chest pain Severe muscle pain (child refuses to walk) Dehydration (no urine for 8 hours-dry mouth,-no tears when crying), Not alert or interacting when awake, Seizures, Fever above 104 degrees Fahrenheit that is not controlled by fever-reducing medicine, In children younger than 12 weeks, any fever, Fever or cough that . improve but then return or worsen, & Worsening of

Adults

Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, Persistent pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen, Persistent dizziness, confusion, inability to arouse, Seizures, Not urinating, Severe muscle pain, Severe weakness or unsteadiness, Fever or cough that improve but then return or worsen, & Worsening of chronic medical conditions,

These lists are not all inclusive. Please consult your medical provider for any other symptom that is severe or concerning.

Prevention

Getting a flu vaccine is a great way to prevent the flu. See your local pharmacy or your provider to schedule a flu vaccine or if you have any questions.






