

I hope by the time you're reading this, you already know; I'm leaving Faith & North New Hope Joint Parish to take a call serving Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Austin, Minnesota. Thank you for being an incredibly generous first call for our family. While we are looking forward to being closer to both our parents & siblings, we will very much miss this community, from which we have built many great relationships.

That being said, it's important that we set good and healthy boundaries for us all. I cannot be your pastor while serving another congregation 230(ish) miles away. No baptisms, weddings, funerals, visitations, or the like; the pastoral ministry of Faith & North New Hope is no longer mine, it's yours, and whoever serves the pastoral office in this time of transition and beyond. As much as I would love continuing to baptize, bury, and marry with you, I'm the pastor of another congregation and its members.

You are in a time of *transition*. You are NOT in the call process. As I told the councils when I broke the news to them in mid-October, this is not a time to form a call committee and begin the search for a new pastor; that comes later. This is the time in between for discernment, wonder, and visioning for your ministry. This is the time to take inventory of your gifts and assets in balance with your needs and requirements. This is the time to explore questions

we have not asked of our ministry in some time: who are we, where are we going, and what is the right ministry model that works for us?

Transition time is a holy time, similar to that of a pregnancy. This time will include moments of discomfort and concern for the future, as well as times of impatience and pain when the future hasn't yet arrived. But hang in there, transition time is investing in the growing, developing, evolving, and maturing that will bring forth a healthy and hearty ministry - when the time is right.

Remember that in the time ahead, you are not alone. Christ promised that where two or three are gathered in his name, he is there also. Look to the God who blesses you with abundant gifts, and trust the Spirit to guide your discernment, wonder, and visioning for your future. Continue to be the welcoming, generous, and faithful communities I have known you to be. Go forth, serve the Lord, and remember that our ministry is one, though our paths may diverge. May God bless and keep you always.

November Parish Nurse Article-Food Safety

Thanksgiving is quickly approaching. I thought it would be

a good time to remind everyone about food safety.

According to the CDC, prevention is the key. Here are some tips for preparing food.

Clean: wash your hands and surfaces often.

Germs that cause food poisoning can survive in many places and spread around your kitchen. Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and warm or cold water before, during, and after preparing food and before eating. Always wash hands after handling uncooked meat, chicken and other poultry, seafood, flour, or eggs. Wash your utensils, cutting boards, and countertops with hot, soapy water after preparing each food item. Rinse fresh fruits and vegetables under running water.

Separate: don't cross-contaminate.

Raw meat, chicken and other poultry, seafood, and eggs can spread germs to ready-to-eat food unless you keep them separate. When grocery shopping, keep raw meat, poultry, seafood, and their juices away from other foods. Keep raw or marinating meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs separate from all other foods in the refrigerator. Store raw meat, poultry, and seafood in sealed containers or wrap them securely so the juices don't leak onto other foods. Use one cutting board or plate for raw meat, poultry, and seafood and a separate cutting board or plate for produce, bread, and other foods that won't be cooked.

Cook to the right temperature.

Food is safely cooked when the internal temperature gets high enough to kill germs that can make you sick. The only way to tell if food is safely cooked is to use a food thermometer. You can't tell if food is safely cooked by checking its color and texture (except for seafood). Whole cuts of beef, veal, lamb, and pork, including fresh ham: 145°F (then allow the meat to rest for 3 minutes before carving or eating)

Fish with fins: 145°F or cook until the flesh is opaque and separates easily with a fork

Ground meats, such as beef and pork: 160°F

All poultry, including ground chicken and turkey: 165°F

Leftovers and casseroles: 165°F

Microwave food thoroughly: Follow recommended cooking and standing times. Letting food sit for a few minutes after microwaving allows cold spots to absorb heat from hotter areas and cook more completely. Know your microwave's wattage. Check inside the door, owner's manual, or manufacturer's website. If your microwave is high wattage (800 watts or more), use the minimum cooking time recommended. If it is low wattage (300–500 watts), use the maximum cooking time recommended. When reheating, use a food thermometer to make sure that microwaved food reaches 165°F.

Chill: refrigerate promptly.

Bacteria can multiply rapidly if left at room temperature or in the "Danger Zone" between 40°F and 140°F. Never leave perishable food out for more than 2 hours (or 1 hour if exposed to temperatures above 90°F). Keep your refrigerator at 40°F or below and your freezer at 0°F or below, and know when to throw food out before it spoils. If your refrigerator doesn't have a built-in thermometer, keep an appliance thermometer inside it to check the temperature.

Package warm or hot food into several clean, shallow containers and then refrigerate. It is okay to put small portions of hot food in the refrigerator since they will chill faster. Refrigerate perishable food (meat, seafood, dairy, cut fruit, some vegetables, and cooked leftovers) within 2 hours. If the food is exposed to temperatures above 90°F, like a hot car or picnic, refrigerate it within 1 hour.

Thaw frozen food safely in the refrigerator, in cold water, or in the microwave. Never thaw food on the counter because bacteria multiply quickly in the parts of the food that reach room temperature.


