Parish Nurse Ministry



December Parish Nurse Article

December is National Hand Hygiene Month. As a nurse, I really like this article as a reminder to everyone. Hand washing is so very important. This is basic information from the CDC.

 Handwashing is an easy, cheap, and effective way to prevent the spread of germs and keep kids and adults healthy. When your family is healthy, you don't have to worry about missing school, work, or other activities.

Handwashing can help prevent diarrhea-related sicknesses and respiratory infections, such as a cold or the flu.

• Parents and caretakers play an important role in teaching children to wash their hands. Handwashing can become a lifelong healthy habit if you start teaching it at an early age. Teach kids these five easy steps: wet, lather, scrub, rinse and dry. The important times to wash hands, are after using the bathroom or before eating. You can find ways to make it fun, like making up your own handwashing song or turning it into a game.

Building handwashing skills takes time. At first, your - child will need regular reminders of how and when to wash hands. It is especially important to remind children to wash their hands after using the bathroom, before eating, after touching pets, after playing outside, and after coughing, sneezing, or blowing their nose. But once handwashing becomes a habit and a I regular part of your child's day, they will practice it throughout their lives.

Lead by example by washing your hands

Young children learn by imitating the behaviors of adults in their lives. When you make handwashing part of your routine, you're setting an example for your children to follow.

If soap and water aren't available

Washing hands with soap and water is the best way to get rid of germs. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that has at least 60% alcohol, and wash your hands with soap and water as soon as you can.

Baby wipes

Baby wipes may make your hands look clean, but they're not designed to remove germs from your hands. CDC recommends washing hands with soap and water when possible.



Candles That Tell a Story

Lighting its candles each Sunday is a treasured tradition during the four weeks of Advent.

Depending on denomination, churches use different color combinations for the candles. Some place four blue candles around the wreath with a white one in the center, while others use all white.

Many light purple candles on the first two Sundays,
pink on the third,
purple again on the fourth,
and then a large white candle on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

Each part of the wreath carries symbolic meaning:

- The wreath: Its circular shape represents the everlasting love of God, having no beginning or end. The green symbolizes eternal life.
- The four candles: Mark the four weeks of Advent. One tradition says that each candle also represents 1,000 years, totaling 4,000 years from Adam and Eve to Christ's birth.
- **Purple candles**: in ancient times, was expensive and was considered the color of royalty and kings. On Christmas, Christ is proclaimed King of Kings. Purple also symbolizes humility and penitence. The first purple candle represents Hope; the second, Peace; and the final purple candle, Love.
- **Blue candles**: Blue is another color often used as a symbol of royalty. Some churches use blue candles to symbolize the night sky and the anticipation of the announcement of Christ's birth. Blue also symbolizes the beginning of a new creation as in the waters of Genesis 1.
- The pink candle: Lit on the third Sunday, it represents Joy and marks the halfway point of Advent.
- The white candle: The large white candle in the center is the Christ candle. Its light symbolizes Christ the Savior "the light of the world."

 The beauty and brightness from the glow of all five candles is a reminder that Christ's life was the light for all earth's people "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it" (John 1:5, NRSV).

The Advent wreath is more than just greenery and candles—it's a symbol of watchfulness and growing joy as Christmas draws near.
