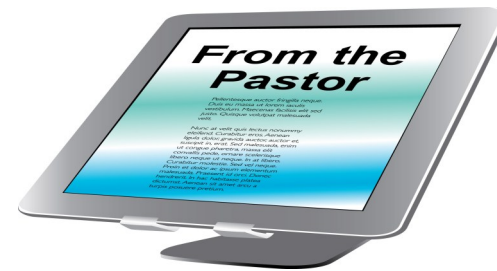

North New Hope



By the time you read this, I hope we have had the opportunity to experience a “Purpose and Values” workshop with Pastor Dara Clifford, Associate to the Bishop and Director for Evangelical Mission in the East Central Synod of Wisconsin. I look forward to this workshop as a time to explore who you are as God’s people of Faith and North New Hope at this moment in time in your life together. Unfortunately, an emergency kept Pastor Dara from attending on June 17<sup>th</sup>, too late to change the plans for the evening.

We discovered something interesting that evening. Members were already preparing food. We didn’t know who was coming. How to get the word out on short notice? So I made the executive decision – let’s meet anyway! Food and fellowship, good reasons to gather! We had a delicious feast – delicious food and informal conversation! We even identified possible dates to meet with Pastor Dara. But they aren’t the only values. What additional foundational principles inform your identity?

I believe you will be served well when you ponder this question before digging deep into the next steps in the call process –

*What are the purpose and values that identify us as these two unique congregations who share a commitment to be the Lutheran Joint Parish, and what does this say to the pastor we call to serve in Christ’s name?*

I look forward to discovering your responses as we continue developing the “Ministry Site Profile” (aka MSP), the next step required in the call process.

## July Parish Nurse Article

### Lyme Disease

Lyme disease bacteria causing human infection in the United States are spread to people by blacklegged ticks. In general, infected ticks must be attached for more than 24 hours to transmit infection; prompt tick removal can prevent transmission. Infected ticks are found most commonly in forested areas in the north-eastern, north-central, and mid-Atlantic states, and in smaller areas within Pacific Coast states.

**How it spreads**-The bacteria that cause Lyme disease in the United States, are spread to people through the bites of infected ticks. Lyme disease can be prevented by avoiding tick bites and promptly removing ticks.

The percentage of ticks that are infected ranges from none to over 50%, depending on the area and life stage.

In general, adult ticks are approximately the size of a sesame seed and nymphal ticks are approximately the size of a poppy seed. Blacklegged ticks have a 2-to-3 year life cycle. During this time, they go through four life stages: egg, larva, nymph, and adult. After the egg hatches, the larva and nymph each must take a blood meal to develop to the next life stage, and the female needs blood to produce eggs. Larval and nymphal ticks can become infected with Lyme disease bacteria when feeding on an infected wildlife host, usually a rodent.

The bacteria are passed along to the next life stage. Nymphs or adult females can then spread the bacteria during their next blood meal. Female ticks infected with Lyme disease bacteria do not pass the infection to their offspring. Deer are a source of blood for ticks and important to tick survival and movement to new areas.

However, deer are not infected with Lyme disease bacteria and do not infect ticks. In most cases, a tick must be attached for more than 24 hours before the Lyme disease bacterium can be transmitted. If you remove a tick within 24 hours, you can greatly reduce your chances of getting Lyme disease. Untreated Lyme disease during pregnancy can lead to infection of the placenta; spread from mother to fetus is possible but extremely rare. Fortunately, with appropriate antibiotic treatment, there is no increased risk of adverse birth outcomes. There are no published studies assessing developmental outcomes of children whose mothers acquired Lyme disease during pregnancy. There are no reports of Lyme disease being spread to infants through breast milk. If you are diagnosed with Lyme disease and are also breastfeeding, make sure that your doctor knows this so that he or she can prescribe an antibiotic that's safe for use when breastfeeding. Although no cases of Lyme disease have been linked to blood transfusion, scientists have found that the Lyme disease bacteria can live in blood that is stored for donation.

Individuals being treated for Lyme disease with an

antibiotic should not donate blood. Individuals who have completed antibiotic treatment for Lyme disease may be considered as potential blood donors. Information on the current criteria for blood donation is available on the Red Cross website.

Although dogs and cats can get Lyme disease, there is no evidence that they spread the infection directly to their owners. However, pets can bring infected ticks into your home or yard. Consider protecting your pet through the use of tick and tickborne disease prevention products for animals. You will not get Lyme disease from eating game meat, but in keeping with general food safety principles, always cook meat thoroughly. Note that hunting and dressing game animals may bring you into close contact with infected ticks. There is no credible evidence that Lyme disease bacteria can be transmitted through air, food, water, or from the bites of mosquitoes, flies, fleas, or lice.

**Prevent tick bites when outdoors**-Avoid grassy, brushy, or wooded areas where ticks live. Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) registered insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, IR3535, oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE), para-menthane-diol (PMD), or 2-undecanone.

**Wear** long-sleeved shirts and pants, or clothing and gear pre-treated with 0.5% permethrin. **Check** your body, clothing, gear, and pets for ticks during and after being outdoors, including in your own backyard. Consider using a lint roller to roll over your skin, clothing, and gear to remove unattached ticks you cannot see.

**Shower** soon after being outdoors to wash off unattached ticks.

**Remove** attached ticks as soon as possible. Do not wait to go to a healthcare provider to remove the tick. Delaying tick removal could increase your risk of getting Lyme disease or other diseases spread through tick bites.

#### Reduce tick habitat in your yard

**Place** a 3-foot-wide barrier of wood chips or gravel between lawns and wooded areas to discourage contact with brushy or grassy borders beyond the lawn.

**Keep** grass mowed, remove leaf litter, and clear tall grasses and brush. Fewer blacklegged ticks have been found on well-maintained lawns that are not near brushy or grassy areas.

**Trim** tree branches and shrubs to let in more sunlight. Ticks are less likely to be found in bright, sunny areas.

**Keep** playground equipment, decks, and patios away from grassy, brushy, or wooded areas.

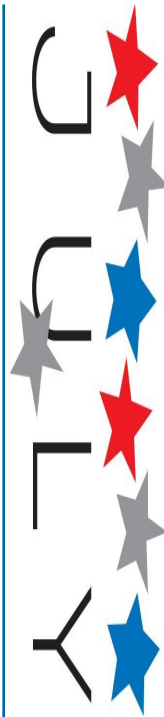

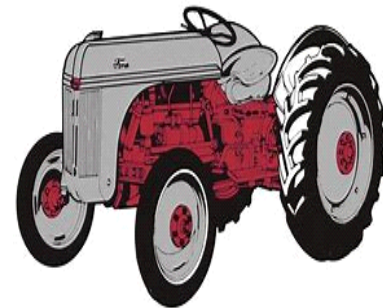
